Event Description: The Stanford University Vietnamese Student Association exists as a campus organization to promote cultural awareness and appreciation among the Vietnamese students at Stanford and address political and social issues pertaining to the Vietnamese population. We also strive to assist the Vietnamese population in the local community. The Vietnamese subgroup is fairly young in comparison to other Asian groups in the United States; many within the subgroup are recent immigrants. Like many other immigrant populations, Vietnamese youth face obstacles in areas cultural and social acclimation, but perhaps most importantly, education. As college students who have successfully navigated through the college application process, we wanted to motivate and encourage Vietnamese youth to pursue higher education. To address the needs of Vietnamese youth, VSA has begun a mentoring program that will specifically target local Vietnamese high school students. Because of the large percentage of Vietnamese people in San Jose, we wanted to pick a high school there, rather than in nearly Palo Alto or Menlo Park. With nearly a third of its student enrollment categorized as Vietnamese, Independence High School in San Jose was selected as the high school to sponsor. Mt Pleasant was also selected for its large Vietnamese population. Our goals for this mentoring program are to provide support and advice to high school students as well as develop strong bonds and friendships with local Vietnamese youth. We hope that through the students' participation in the program, the students will feel more empowered and confident about applying to college and also have a stronger, more positive attitude about higher education.

This mentoring program will sponsor two retreats each quarter, in which the students from Independence and Mt Pleasant High School will be picked up and transported to Stanford usually on a Friday afternoon. The students will stay either until Friday night or overnight and finish Saturday afternoon. Planned topics of discussion for these retreats will be: formulating a four-year plan for college admission, choosing a college, college admissions tests, and college admissions essays. We will also include social and cultural events. Expenses will include: college binders filled with worksheets and handouts pertaining to college preparation, SAT preparation books and materials, and costs for food, transportation, and cultural events.
