Yes, there is a slight increase in the amount of money we are requesting. The major reason for the increase is the rising costs of paying musicians. With prices rising, their fees are also rising and we're asking for more money to comensate for that.

The Stanford Jazz Orchestra uses the Special Fee to help pay for the guest artists we bring the perform with us at our quarterly concerts. The presence of guest artists significantly increases attendance and allows Stanford students to hear world-renowned musicians for a very small cost.

Currently, we have 10932.19 in assets, split between honoraria fees, our discretionary account, equipment, and event food. All but the discretionary account were funded by special fees. The only other source of revenue we have is CD sales, which are deposited into the discretionary account.

What events/programs does your group hold throughout the vear for the Stanford Community?

Every quarter, the Stanford Jazz Orchestra performs a concert that is open to everyone to attend. These concerts are both educational and enjoyable for the students that attend. For each quarterly concert, we invite a guest artist to play with us, a standard thing for all college groups to do. They are always world class jazz musicians, and students get to see them for far less money than they would at any other venue. Recent examples of artists include Louis Bellson, John Faddis, and Carl Allen. Each is a world leader in the jazz community and history.

Honoraria makes up 94% of our budget. This is what we use to pay our guest artists for their time and services. We also are requesting small amounts for refreshments and equipment, as band-owned equipment often needs to be replaced or purchased.

What is the average attendance at your events?

We are generally able to fill Dinklespiel auditorium at all of our indoor concerts.

What is the fundamental goal/purpose of your VSO (please limit your response to 50-100 words)?

The Stanford Jazz Orchestra is just that - a standard big band style jazz band. We play a wide range of jazz music, from classic swing (Ellington, Basie) to modern jazz (Maria Schneider, Bob Brookmeyer). Our role on campus is twofold. We provide a medium through which interested musicians are able to play the music that they love. We also offer all Stanford students the opportunity to come to our quarterly concerts, each featuring a world-class jazz musicians. Students get to see them for far less money than they would at any other venue. Recent examples of artists include Louis Bellson, John Faddis, and DeeDee Bridgewater. We not only perform in these quarterly concerts, but we also send small groups to play at smaller events for students and faculty, such the Art Affair and ASSU functions.

What percentage of your total membership is undergraduate? Graduate?

100% undergraduate

Why are you requesting Special Fees?

We are asking for Special Fees because the Stanford Jazz Orchestra runs a rather large budget. The cost of our guest musicians is very high compared to our concert revenue. Yet these guest artists are necessary for the success of the group, as they draw enough people to see the concert, as well as help educate members of the group about music. Students get to see the concerts for much cheaper (\$2) than they would through any other venue.
