## QUESTIONS \& ANSWERS

Have you applied for Special Fees in the past 3 years? If so, please detail the outcome of each attempt.
Yes. Last year we applied for $\$ 19,634.58$ in special fees. We were approved for $\$ 16,419.31$. We petitioned and were elected for $\$ 19,634.58$. Two years ago, we applied for and received significantly less special fees: approximately $\$ 10,000$. Three years ago, we applied for and recieved even less special fees: approximately $\$ 4000$. I was not the financial officer in these last two years and therefore don't have more specifics.

If you applied for Special Fees last year, is there an increase in the amount you're seeking this year? If so, why?
There is a $2.90 \%$ increase in the amount we are seeking. This increase reflects increased participation in the Model UN team as well as projections for a larger high school conference next year.

Please define the services provided by your group with the Special Fee, as per the ASSU Constitution:
SIAS engages the campus on topics relating to international affairs on two levels. First, it seeks to educate students and other members of the Stanford community about topics of international interest by bringing speakers and running an SIC. Second, it seeks to provide a structured opportunity for students already interested in international relations and foreign affairs to gain valuable policy making skills and a deeper understanding of points of international tension. In particular, the students that participate in our Stanford's traveling Model UN Team learn many valuable skills. First, diplomacy and policy making skills are taught in the grueling hours of negotiation and resolution writing at conferences. Second, public speaking skills are honed over dozens of speeches, some planned and others impromptu, given before the committee. Finally, research skills are polished through the preparation before the conference.

What are the three largest line item requests in your budget and why?
The three largest expenses in our budget all relate to travel. In particular, tickets to Chicago and Boston are somewhat expensive from the bay area and accommodations at Harvard's Model UN conference tend to be quite pricey.

How do you plan to publicize your events/programs to the greater Stanford community? Have you registered with Events at Stanford?
We publicize our events (i.e. Speaker's Series and Model UN tryouts) through email and fliers. We have found that emails are the best ways to reach out to freshmen dorms to recruit new members for the Model UN Team and that physical flyering, in conjunction with emails, is the best way to inform efficiently a large swath of students about our events.

## What events/programs does your group hold throughout the

 year for the Stanford Community?The Society for International Affairs at Stanford (SIAS) is a student group consisting of four branches: the Intercollegiate Model United Nations (MUN) team, Stanford Model United Nations Conference (SMUNC) for high school students, Speaker Series, and Community Service. Each branch has a distinct function within SIAS and exposes the Stanford community to international affairs in its own way. It is of note, that many students participate in more than one part of SIAS.

SIAS runs Stanford's Intercollegiate Model United Nations Team which represents Stanford at competitive collegiate MUN conferences all over the country. A Model United Nations conference is a 3-4 day simulation of UN, NATO, EU, and similar committees. It is hosted by a university MUN club and attended by as many as 50 or more universities from all over the world. Students from visiting schools act as country delegates and the host university provides committee chairs and fills the UN Secretariat. We attend about 4 conferences a year.

SMUNC is a high school Model United Nations conference organized and run by SIAS members. High schoolers from around the world come to debate international issues in committees modeling United Nations assemblies. SMUNC attendance this year was near 500 high school students.

The Community Service portion of SIAS is focused on Bay Area outreach and teaching in the area of international relation. Last year SIAS members mentored several local middle and high school teams on research over selected international issues. The results of the research were presented at Project SPERA World Affairs Challenge with one of our teams winning 3rd place. Community Service is the newest of the SIAS branches and will expand rapidly as funding and interest become available.

## Why are you requesting Special Fees?

We are requesting Special Fees because we believe that maintaining the several branches of SIAS provides a valuable service to the Stanford community but is expensive. The primary expense incurred by SIAS is on behalf of its Model United Nations team. We attend 4 or so Model UN conferences a year. To each conference we make between 15 and 20 or a bit more students. This means that we have to pay for transportation for between 60 and 80+ students annually. Also, registration at Model UN conferences is not cheap and neither are the accommodations. The problem with accommodations is that most MUN conferences will be held in a hotel, forcing delegations to stay in that one location. This restricts our ability to find good deals on hotel rooms.

## What is the average attendance at your events?

We host/attend three kinds of events as an organization. The first is Model UN conferences where 15-20 Stanford students, who comprise the Model UN team that we run, attend a multi-day simulation of the UN in which as much as several thousand students from across the world will participate.

The second is speaker events that SIAS periodically puts on. These vary in scope from speeches at our SIC or group meetings to larger talks or series of talks. Anywhere from 20 to 50 students will attend these.
