Have you applied for Special Fees in the past 3 years? If so, please detail the outcome of each attempt.

We have applied for Special Fees during each of the past three years. Last year we applied for \$32895.00 and received \$32895.00. Two years ago we applied for \$33,040.00 and three years ago we applied for \$33,810.00.

If you applied for Special Fees last year, is there an increase in the amount you're seeking this year? If so, why?

We are applying for the same amount of special fees that we applied for last year, we modified line items as we saw fit, moving funds from underspent line items to those that need more funds.

Please define the services provided by your group with the Special Fee, as per the ASSU Constitution:

The Stanford American Indian Organization is the social, political, educational and cultural hub for the Native American community at Stanford. SAIO is the umbrella organization of American Indians, Alaska Natives and Native Hawaiians at Stanford that addresses the social, political, educational, and cultural issues of the community.

What are the three largest line item requests in your budget and why?

Honoraria, Transportation, Event food. Honoraria is large for Powwow because of the size of the event and the Native Speakers series is large because it is a year long initiative. We request a large amount for transportation expenses because most of our speakers are not from the Bay area. Event food is high because we hold many events throughout the year to spread awareness of native cultures that have little other costs besides event food.

What is the average attendance at your events?

Excluding Powwow, general SAIO events average approximately 40 people. Powwow draws around 30,000 attendees. We also started the annual Native Film Festival this year and are co-sponsors the Stanford lu'au and these events average 200-300 people each.

How do you plan to publicize your events/programs to the greater Stanford community? Have you registered with Events at Stanford?

SAIO uses the Native American Cultural Center's calendar to advertise all of its events. We will send out e-mails and electronic flyers, use events@stanford, post paper flyers, posters, and postcards, and spread information by word of mouth. Our president is registered with Events at Stanford.

We have hosted Indigenous People's Day, Native American Awareness Week, Mabel Pike as a visiting Native American artist, and our biggest event is Powwow. We are also holding the Native American Speaker series, and throughout the year our umbrella organizations host talks and presentations by speakers from their tribes.

Special Fees is the sole income of SAIO and enables us to continue our programming. It allows us to support Native American students as well as promote cultural awareness in the Stanford Community.
