QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Have you applied for Special Fees in the past 3 years? If so, please detail the outcome of each attempt.

Yes. In previous years, we have always applied for Special Fees and have been approved by Appropriations, placed on the ballot, and received enough votes to receive our budgets in full. This is what I have gathered to the best of my ability, but since no one from the SAIO officer core of 2-3 years ago is here any longer, it is just my best guess.

If you applied for Special Fees last year, is there an increase in the amount you're seeking this year? If so, why?

The only increase in our requested budget between this year and last year is from the adjustment for inflation of less than 2.7%. In fact, SAIO has kept our increase to just below 2.5% to account for inflation.

Please define the services provided by your group with the Special Fee, as per the ASSU Constitution:

As a programming group that would be receiving funding from ASSU Special Fees, we provide services mainly but not limited to the Native American, Native Alaskan, and Native Hawaiian community. We encourage our members to share what they know of their own cultures with the greater Stanford community, whether that be perspective on diversity issues, differing morals/values, or new ideas based on their own cultural knowledge. In addition, SAIO attempts to bring outside knowledge on Native issues by inviting Native leaders and speakers to the Stanford campus to supplement the somewhat lacking Native faculty/staff. Special Fees helps us to bring these speakers and to hold public events in which we can share bits and pieces of our culture (through food, stories, dance, song, craft, etc.) with whoever is willing to learn.

How do you plan to publicize your events/programs to the greater Stanford community? Have you registered with Events at Stanford?

For larger events, we create flyers that are printed, copied, and posted up around campus. In addition, we also send emails out to as many email lists as possible. For smaller events, we only use email lists.

Our larger events, like Powwow and Indigenous People's Day for example, are registered individually with Events. However, since our SAIO budget is divided up amongst smaller groups, events thrown by these smaller groups are not always registered with Events.

What are the three largest line item requests in your budget and why?

The largest line item requests are Honoraria, Event Food, and Accommodations, in that order. Honoraria is the largest of all because of the large sum that we use to help put on the annual Stanford Powwow (through the hiring of staff members, dancers, and drummers). In addition to that, SAIO tries to bring in lots of Native speakers. The reason for this is that Native peoples believe strongly in the passing of knowledge from one's elders down to us. Also, Stanford is actually rather lacking in Native faculty and staff, so we try to bring in Native leaders from outside the Stanford community.

In regards to Event Food, most of our speaker sessions are held during lunch. This allows us to feed our guest as well as get more people to come to the event. Lunch speaker sessions produce the greatest number of attendees, not because there is food, but because people are less likely to be in a class, have a meeting for another group/club, or be busy with homework and studying. In the case of the cultural dinners that we provide, Native cultures are closely tied to the traditional foods of that particular culture, so sharing our culture with the Stanford community also involves sharing our food. Each group has a repertoire of their own culture's dishes that we introduce to and exchange with each other by having dinners showcasing said dishes.

Lastly, Accommodations are the third largest line item because, although not all our speakers stay overnight, some do come a far distance to see us. We try our best to subsidize the cost of staying at least one night at the Stanford Terrace Inn (currently running at \$170/room/night at its cheapest, which is more than the allotted \$125/night from ASSU).

What is the average attendance at your events?

Average attendance varies by type of event and by who it is being hosted by (ex: Natives In Medicine vs. Hui o Hawaii). There are usually at least 15-20 people at smaller events, about 30-40 at most of our larger events. However, again, depending on the event, we may end up with more in attendance; we've seen a small event that was well advertised that ended up having close to 60 people attend.

What events/programs does your group hold throughout the year for the Stanford Community?

Annually, SAIO puts on many events that are open to the Stanford Community. In no particular order: Stanford Powwow, co-sponsoring of Lu'au, celebration of Indigenous People's Day, events put on for Indigenous People's Awareness Month (some held by smaller umbrella'ed groups), speaker series on Native issues, moccasin making with Tlingit elder Mabel Pike, cultural food dinners, film showings relating to Native topics/issues.

Why are you requesting Special Fees?

Since SAIO is an organization that was made for Native students by Native students, we feel that Special Fees is the best way for us to get funding, not just for our organization, but for the smaller groups that we umbrella over. SAIO always receives its funding from Special Fees each year, and we would be hard pressed to find the same funding elsewhere.
