Have you applied for Special Fees in the past 3 years? If so, please detail the outcome of each attempt.

Yes. Last year, SPOON received Special Fees, and had one of the highest number of votes for any special fees group. I'm fairly positive that SPOON received Special Fees in the years prior as well.

If you applied for Special Fees last year, is there an increase in the amount you're seeking this year? If so, why?

There is a dramatic decrease, due to reduced need in funds for major operations, and our attempt to be more sustainable with our reusable tins pilot program.

Please define the services provided by your group with the Special Fee, as per the ASSU Constitution:

SPOON will use our special fee funds to provide countless opportunities of service for individuals and student groups, while making a huge impact on the Palo Alto community by providing approximately 50,000 meals a year to the Palo Alto homeless. We will also educate students on the importance of hunger and homelessness awareness, and provide this by bringing in intellectual speakers with experience addressing these problems.

What are the three largest line item requests in your budget and why?

1. One time use tins. These are the core of SPOON's operation and purpose on campus. Due to the many complications with reusable tins (including issues such as: too large to store in dining hall refrigerators, re-training required in dining halls for current employees, as well as the dining halls having to re-wash every reusable tin in accordance with the food safety policies), SPOON uses one time use tins for safety and due to lack of available on campus resources. However, this year SPOON will be starting a pilot program to use reusable tins for daily pick-ups at Tresidder and Faculty Club in order to reduce costs and be more sustainable.

What is the average attendance at your events?

25-30 for small events, ~100 for larger events

How do you plan to publicize your events/programs to the greater Stanford community? Have you registered with Events at Stanford?

We will hold large talks with famous out of town speakers, such as Syd Mandelbaum - Founder of Rock & Dramp; amp; amp; Wrap It UP! - a anti-hunger and anti-poverty think tank that recovers food and other assets in order to assist agencies fighting poverty, increasing their operation budgets. We also will have two talks per quarter with Stanford faculty who are influential in the fight against hunger and poverty.

Why are you requesting Special Fees?

SPOON needs special fees in order to fund our various missions on campus, which include: collecting food waste on campus and delivering the food to the Opportunity Center in Palo Alto, giving individuals and groups opportunities for one-time and regular community service by collecting food from various on campus locations, as well as helping groups get the resources to have breakfast cooks where they can serve food to the homeless. We also hold regular events with food and speakers to help educate students on the issue of hunger in the United States and abroad. Our regular operations of food collection and maintenance can become costly, causing SPOON to request additional funding beyond that of the general fees.
